Introduction

In 2002 the European Commission adopted AlBan, a high level scholarship programme specifically addressed to Latin America. It is expected that until 2010 around 3900 Latin American students and professionals will benefit from these scholarships, in the European Union.

The Programme AlBan aims at the reinforcement of the European Union-Latin America co-operation in the area of Higher Education and covers studies for postgraduates as well as higher training for Latin America professionals/future decision-makers, in institutions or centres in the European Union. Further to opening-up of the European Higher Education Area to Latin Americans AlBan scholarships will contribute to better employability skills and career opportunities for Latin American postgraduates and professionals in their own countries.

The Programme AlBan awards scholarships to Latin American citizens, from Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Uruguay and Venezuela, to develop postgraduate studies, professional training or upgrading, in any of the European Union Member States (Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Cyprus, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, The Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, United Kingdom).

The Fourth Call for Applications was opened on the 12th October 2005 and closed on the 28th December 2005. A total of 3370 applications were received from the Latin American countries of which 2407 met the eligibility criteria to be considered for support.

Applications were accepted in all subject areas with the exception of language learning. Applicants for AlBan scholarships are required to be supported by a home institution or organization and must have been accepted for higher level education or training by another institution or training centre in the European Union. Eligible HEI's are those recognised as such by their country's competent national authorities. The Portal AlBan (<http://www.programalban.org>) and the Programme AlBan website (<http://europa.eu.int/comm/europeaid/projects/alban>) list such institutions per LA and EU country participating in AlBan. The host organisations for professional higher level training or upgrading must be recognised as such in their countries.

This document includes detailed statistical data about the applications received for Austria during the Third Call for Scholarship Applications 2005.
